

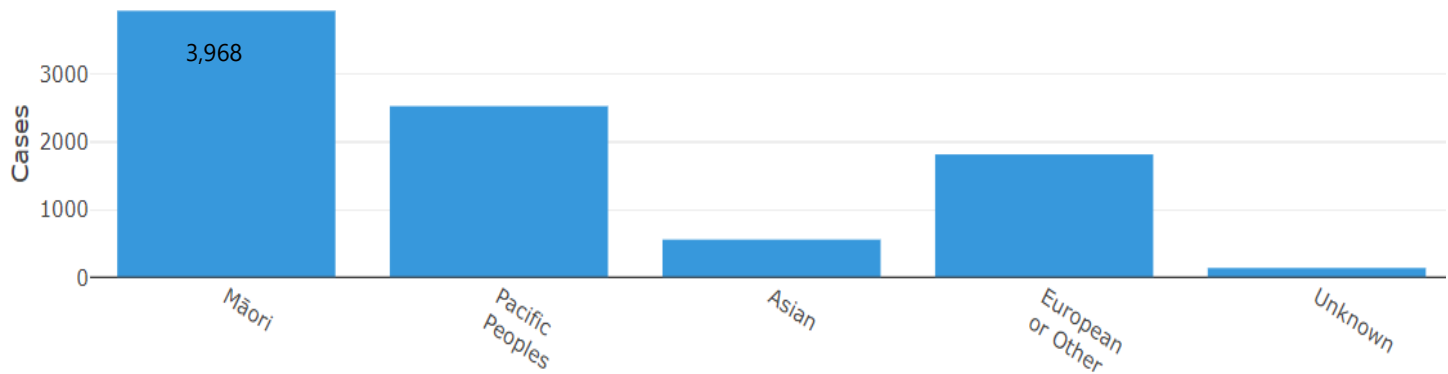


### Total Māori case numbers 17<sup>th</sup> August – 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2021

Whānau Māori case numbers have notably dropped from last week (-193). Hospitalisations continue to grow in percentage of all cases but this was also less (-1%) than last week.

### Māori Vaccination to 90% coverage as at 3<sup>rd</sup> December 2021

All rohe were the same or increased the percentage of first and second doses provided in the last seven days. Auckland and Capital and Coast DHB's had just over 100 doses to give to reach 90% first dose coverage. Northland, Counties-Manukau, Waikato and Bay of Plenty DHBs have the biggest number of whānau yet to reach for first doses.

### Full Vaccination national coverage week to 28th November 2021

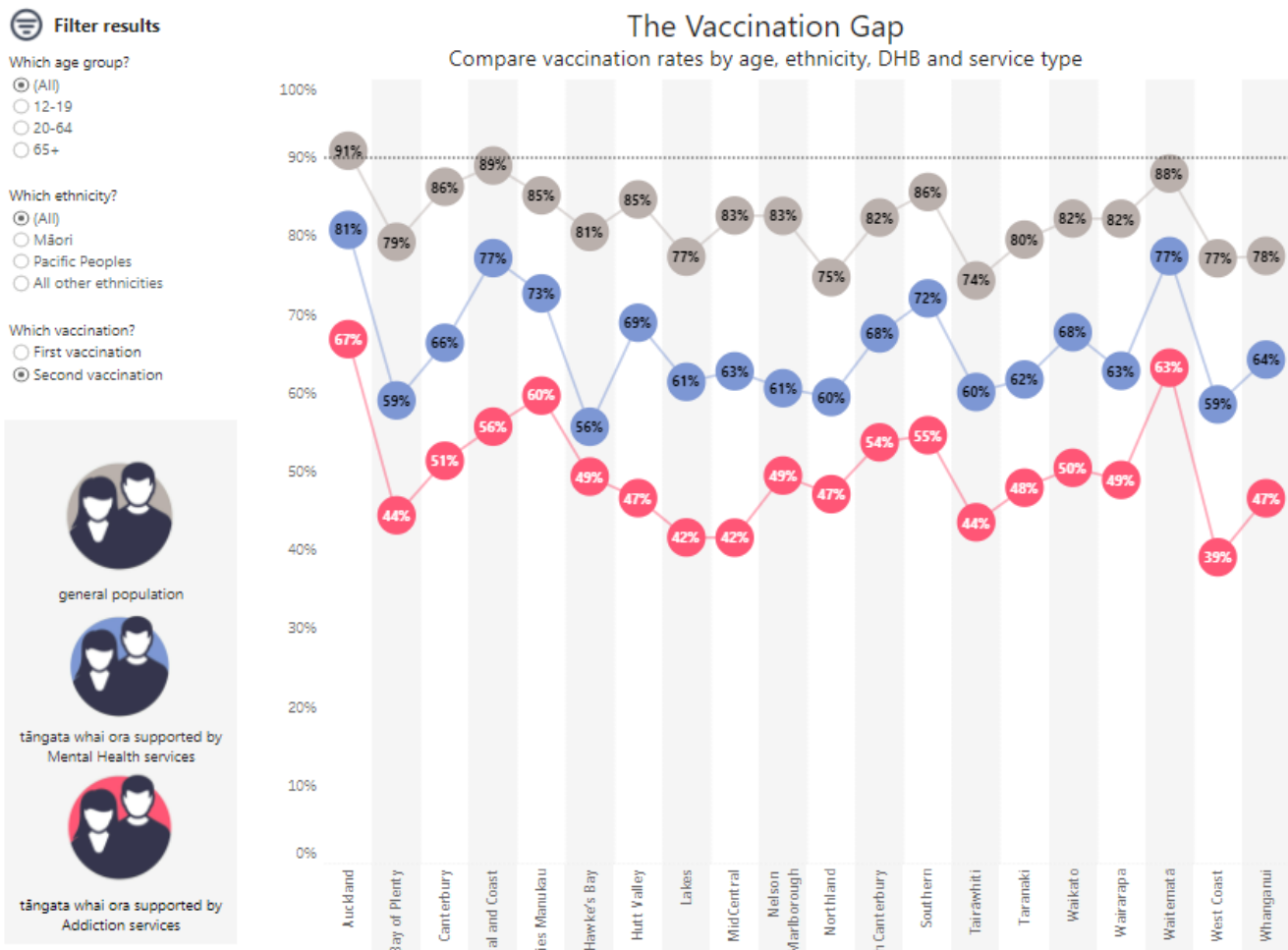
Kaumtua aged 65+ have remained at 94% second dose coverage, with only 72 additional doses given in last week. All other age groups continue to climb in coverage, with 50-64 years getting closer to 90%. Rangatahi 12-34 years had the biggest change in uptake, likely reflecting the mahi going into the vaccination campaigns. Changes in equity ratio this week reflect this with an increase in the 20-34 year age group indicating that efforts to improve equity for this group are having an impact.

### Tāngata Whaiora second dose vaccination coverage as of 22<sup>nd</sup> November 2021

Tāngata whaiora especially addiction service users, are lagging behind in vaccination uptake. COVID-19 is a high risk for these whānau due to often having other health conditions and medical needs.
