Will there be a contract?

Yes, successful applicants will sign a grant agreement to deliver the project they receive the pūtea for.

When will funding be available?

An upfront payment will be made upon signing the grant agreement. Another payment will be made two weeks before the wānanga or hīkoi takes place, then a final payment will be made once the project completion report is submitted.

Can I still apply if my Project doesn't seem to fit the themes?

Our Ancestral Landscapes programme theme supports wānanga and hīkoi that revitalises mātauranga associated with wāhi tapu, wāhi tūpuna, ngā tapuwae o ngā tūpuna and other Māori heritage places. Our Māori Built Heritage programme theme includes the mātauranga surrounding Māori traditional arts and construction, including the architecture of the marae. If you're not sure if your proposal fits the themes, get in touch with us to discuss your project via the email address maraeheritage@heritage.org.nz

How will our Intellectual Property be protected?

All mātauranga offered by the whānau remains with the whānau; any sharing of mātauranga generated as a result of the project is approved beforehand by the whānau.

How will your application be processed

1

once a complete Expression of Interest form is received you will receive a confirmation email

2

applications are reviewed and contact made if further information or clarification is required.

3

in January 2023 we will get in touch with all applicants to advise them if they are successful in progressing to the next stage of detailed application.

4

detailed applications including project proposal and budgets are received and reviewed. Successful applicants will be notified in early February 2023.

5

a grant agreement is drawn up and signed by both parties including a payment schedule and milestones. The project needs to be completed by June 2023
