If entering the Treaty Grounds via the Hobson Memorial plaque, follow the path past Te Whare Tiriti, and the marquee will be positioned in front of Te Whare Rūnanga.

If entering via the Waharoa, Treaty Grounds staff will be able to direct you from here. You can take one of the paths leading to Te Whare Tiriti, or walk along Tau Henare Drive up to the Hobson Memorial plaque, then follow the directions above. The walk will take approximately 10 minutes.

What does an Entity do?

Within the Three Waters reform programme, the Government has adopted a four-entity model, proposing boundaries for four publicly-owned water entities to manage wastewater, storm water and drinking water services in Aotearoa.

These entities are based on scale and population size, and are defined as:

Entity A - Auckland and Northland

Entity B - Central North Island including Taranaki

Entity C - East Coast North Island, including the top of the South Island

Entity D - Remainder of the South Island.
