I'm semi-retired and spend 80% of my time working on the whenua of Kowhairoa Peninsula Historic Reserve with a team of 5 conducting pest and predator control of both flora and fauna, with the long-range goal of establishing a "Predator Free Mainland Island Sanctuary." This whenua of

700 acres was returned to the Iwi as part of our Treaty of Waitangi settlement 2017.

Also co-manage two other projects: (1) A programme of raising and planting rakau Maori within the Reserve funded by the 1 Billion Tree Programme MPI, \$1.5m over 3 years. (2) A Jobs for Nature programme track cutting. Pest and Predator control. Funded by DOC, \$2.2m over 3 years. Currently employ a team of 6 plus two contractors, 3 pers, 1 Admin.

My Mokos keep me focused, and my mahi is entirely about them. Me nga tini te whakaheke.
